



## GENERAL VISA INFORMATION

**Canadian passport:** holders with at least 6 months validity remaining on passport and a confirmed ticket out of Thailand (proof of leaving within 30 days) do not need a visa for visiting Thailand up to 30 days for tourism purposes. While those entering Thailand overland from neighbouring countries for tourism purposes may stay for up to 15 days.

**Important Notice:** Upon arrival in Thailand, please check the last date which you are allowed to stay in Thailand stamped in your passport by the Thai Immigration Officer upon arrival. If you stay beyond the specified date, you may receive a fine for overstaying in Thailand. The Royal Thai Consulate-General cannot be held responsible for any fine incurred as a result of your violation of Thai Immigration Law.

### A: Required Documentation:

<b>Transit Visa</b> (for connecting flight) <u>not exceeding 30 days</u>	<b>\$35.00 single</b>	<b>\$70.00 double</b>	
<b>Tourist Visa</b> <u>not exceeding 60 days</u>	<b>\$40.00 single</b>	<b>\$80.00 double</b>	<b>\$120.00 triple</b>
<b>Non-Immigrant Visa</b> (not for tourism purpose) <u>not exceeding 90 days</u>	<b>\$70.00 single</b>	<b>\$180.00 multiple</b>	

(Granting the one year multiple entry is only under discretion of the Consul.)

1. A valid Canadian passport must be submitted with an application form. The passport should be valid for at least 6 months and contain some blank visa pages. A visa is issued in the form of a sticker in the applicant's passport. The visa will include details of the type and class. Each visa will show issue and expiry dates. **Damaged, invalid or altered passports will not be accepted.** Failure to observe this request may result in the refusal of a visa.
2. One recent passport photograph must be submitted with the application form. The Consulate will not accept photocopies or scanned photos.
3. One completed visa application form must be printed clearly in black or blue ink.
4. Copy of flight ticket or itinerary

### Additional documentation maybe required for employment, volunteer or for study in Thailand.

1. An official original letter from your employer or school from Thailand;
2. Copy of the business / institutional licenses ( business registration papers, company profile), work permit;
3. Copy of the signed contract;
4. Police Check Certificate not valid more than six months (required for teaching);
5. Copy of Diploma/Degree

In all cases, the consul may request additional information or documentation depending on the type of visa being issued. Your application may be refused or delayed due to unforeseen circumstances.

**B: Validity of a visa:** The validity means the period within which the traveller may present the visa for entry, not the duration of staying in Thailand. Visas must be used within 90 days from the date of its issuance (six months in cases of more than 1 entry).

**C: Visas by mail:** Royal Thai Consulate General is not responsible for any loss or damage to your passport and documents due to mishandling by mail services.

If you are sending your application by mail, please send along with a pre-paid self-addressed envelope and provide a money order payable to the "Royal Thai Consulate General"; no personal cheques, debit cards, and credit cards will be accepted.
